BPCP SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM FACTS

Through collaboration, Balboa Park has saved 3,800,000 kWhs in energy & 100,000 therms in gas annually from building retrofits. An additional 6,200,000 kWhs & 100,000 therms are identified, which all together, is estimated will save Park institutions \$1.5M a year in utility bills while helping to preserve Balboa Park for future generations.
